


Unless otherwise stated (in brackets) all above figures have a number \* of CAST-ON head variations per code number., with different facial expressions, head gear & beards, etc.

The majority of PIKEMEN are cast with a variation of helmets - MORION, POT or CABASSET - (with a small proportion of MONTEROE). The majority of MUSKETEERS have the SOFT HAT with a few variations in MONTEROE & STOCKING CAP.

Although the variations are mixed within each code, MUSKETEERS may be supplied with a choice of HAT, MONTEROE or STOCKING (or Monmouth) CAP.


OFFICERS, STANDARD BEARERS, DRUMMERS & SERGEANTS are supplied with a choice of HAT or HELMET (small proportion of Monteroe & Monmouth with Drummers & Sergeants)


CAVALRY - Choice of 'lobster' pot or hat unless otherwise listed. Curassiers are classed as "Extra Heavy" cavalry & have full armours (as if you didn't know!)

As shapes & sizes of horses varied enormously, the lighter horses may also be used for heavy cavalry. Conversly, the heavier horses may also be used for some light cavalry.





Unless otherwise listed in brackets all above figures have a number of CAST-ON head variations per code number with different facial expressions, beards, clean shaven, etc. The majority of Lowland Scots & Highlands are supplied in the Scots Bonnet unless otherwise listed.

A number of barcheaded variants can also be included with the rougher, less well equipped highlanders.
